ECOLOGICAL SERVICES

From baseline condition assessments and photo-point monitoring to ongoing evaluations of management effectiveness, PCL's qualified and experienced Landcare Officers apply the latest techniques and best-practice methodologies in natural resource management. This includes contemporary survey methods and species management strategies aligned with local, state, and federal legislation, ensuring the delivery of effective, evidence-based environmental outcomes.

PEST FLORA & FAUNA MANAGEMENT

From surveys and management plans to on-ground herbicide application and fauna trapping, PCL's experienced team is equipped to deliver every stage of pest management from planning through to implementation.

OUR TEAM PROVIDES:

- Weed surveys, short and long term monitoring, mapping, management and treatment plans
- integrated weed treatment solutions using licensed field crew and purpose-fit equipment to ensure safe, effective, and compliant outcomes
- Invasive species identification training and awareness
- Ground and aerial (drone) surveying
- Management of invasive species control activities
- Coordination of community and stakeholder engagement
- Technical reporting encompassing data comparison, spatial mapping, tailored control strategies, and evidence-based recommendations to inform ongoing land management.

BUSHLAND MAINTENANCE

PCL provides regular on-the-ground maintenance across bushland and natural areas, including pathway clearing, invasive weed control, small and large tree removal, and general vegetation management. These services support public safety, enhance biodiversity, and ensure the long-term health and resilience of local ecosystems.

- Technical reporting and mapping

COMMUNITY-LED CONSERVATION

PCL delivers well-managed, community-led conservation programs by coordinating over 200 volunteers annually across diverse projects, including citizen science, habitat restoration, and marine debris clean-ups. PCL oversees the full volunteer lifecycle-from recruitment and WHS induction to on-ground supervision, data collection, and reporting-ensuring safe, meaningful engagement and measurable environmental outcomes.

Volunteer Program Management

PCL delivers end-to-end volunteer program management that responds to the values, needs, and priorities of our local community. From initial recruitment and onboarding through to WHS inductions, in-field supervision, data capture, and final reporting, every stage is carefully planned to ensure a safe, rewarding, and impactful experience for volunteers. All programs are supported by in-house developed resources—including instructional handbooks, fact sheets, posters, visual WHS guides, and species ID cards—ensuring consistent messaging, effective knowledge transfer, and high-quality outcomes. PCL's volunteer initiatives are designed to foster community ownership, build local capacity, and deliver real environmental benefits across the region.

Tailored, Field-Based Environmental Training

PCL specialises in the design and delivery of regionally relevant, field-based training programs that are aligned with both volunteer capabilities and ecological priorities. Our workshops combine scientific rigor with hands-on learning, covering topics such as:

- Species identification (including marine and terrestrial fauna and flora).
- Ethical handling and survey methods.
- Field safety and WHS compliance.
- Use of tools such as GPS and trail cameras.
- Data collection and entry protocols using platforms such as iNaturalist, Feral Scan, ALA, Frog ID, Bio Collect, QGlobe.

Trusted by Industry and Community

PCL has built strong partnerships with key stakeholders including the Department of Environment, Tourism, Science and Innovation (DETSI), Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service (QPWS), Reef Catchments, and local councils. We are regularly engaged by these bodies to deliver training and lead volunteer programs that require both scientific integrity and community trust.



OUR PROGRAMS

With the power of collaboration, Pioneer Catchment Landcare generates employment through large – scale projects and delivers significant regional conservation, restoration and land management programs.

Land for Wildlife Program



The Land for Wildlife program supports private landholders to voluntarily manage part or all of their property for nature conservation. It provides free advice, resources, and recognition to help landholders protect native plants, animals, and ecosystems. Participants receive property visits, technical support, and access to workshops and networking opportunities. The program encourages the integration of conservation with other land uses, such as agriculture or tourism.

Junior Landcare



PCL offers a Junior Landcare program through its Landcare School Support initiative, engaging children in environmental stewardship across the Mackay region. These experiences aim to teach young learners about biodiversity, sustainability, and the importance of caring for their local environment. By fostering early connections with nature, PCL's Junior Landcare program nurtures a lifelong appreciation for environmental conservation among the younger generation.

Landholder Support Program



PCL's Landholder Support Program provides tailored, on-ground advice to help property owners protect and enhance the natural values of their land. The program supports activities such as weed management, native vegetation restoration, erosion control, and habitat improvement. Landholders receive site visits, management recommendations, and access to technical resources. The aim is to empower landholders to integrate conservation practices with productive land use, contributing to a healthier landscape across the Pioneer Catchment.

Community & Volunteering Events



PCL offers a range of volunteer opportunities throughout the year for community members to get involved in hands-on conservation. Whether it's joining a citizen science field trip, lending a hand on a tree planting day, or helping in the nursery, there's something for everyone. 






NATIVE SPECIES EXCELLENCE

PCL works in partnership with the Mackay Natural Environment Centre (MNEC) nursery, specialising native plant species endemic to the Central Queensland Coast Bioregion. The nursery propagates over 100,000 plants annually, supporting various environmental programs and projects across the region.

The PCL depot is located within the nursery compound, allowing staff to closely monitor and manage plant propagation and growth, while also utilising the nursery facilities for specialised projects.
